AUSTIN, Texas, Aug 16, 2010 (BUSINESS WIRE) -- Silicon Laboratories Inc. (Nasdaq: SLAB) today announced the filing of a patent infringement lawsuit against Airoha Technology Corporation, a Taiwan-based IC maker, in the U.S. Federal District Court in Austin, Texas.

The lawsuit alleges that Airoha has infringed two patents relating to mixed-signal integrated circuits, specifically United States Patents No. 6,226,506 and No. 6,233,441 with, but not limited to, its FM receiver products.
